Migration is not just a phenomenon of the present. It has always shaped our societies, taken place across centuries, and is a normal part of human history.

Yet, migration often only comes into focus when problems arise or when it is discussed in the context of conflict.

The exchange project MIGR-ACTION aims to raise awareness about migration – past, present, and future – and promote a more positive and nuanced perspective. The relationships between the participating countries have always been complex and interconnected, often driven by economic interests. MIGR-ACTION goes beyond numbers. It asks: Why do people leave their homes? What dreams, challenges, or hopes drive them? And how do societies respond – with openness, curiosity, or resistance?

Together with experts, we'll also take a closer look at migration policies, immigration laws, and



integration strategies in the four participating countries – always with a focus on human rights. Especially in times when fear of immigration and racism are on the rise, it's more important than ever to highlight what connects us as human beings, to stand up against discrimination, and to reflect on the value of freedom, solidarity, and respect for human dignity.

32 young people from Germany, France, Italy, and Tunisia are coming together. All participants are between 18 and 26 years old – whether they're trainees, students, or just starting out in their careers.

We especially want to encourage young people with immigrant backgrounds or international life stories to join in. Everyone should be up for taking part in all activities and able to speak English well enough to follow what's going on and join the conversations. You'll dive into creative workshops, open discussions, and small trips around the area.

THE LOCATION

The Centre de vacances de Bondy "Le Pêcher" is located on the edge of Saint-Benoît-du-Sault, about 400 meters from the medieval village center (bars, restaurants, shops, supermarket). The nearby village of Roussines is 4 km away and easily accessible by road.

Set in a 34-hectare park with a lake, the holiday camp offers accommodation in a former farm building with 100 dormitory beds. Rooms will be shared by 2 to 4 people, with shared toilets and showers. The center also features Wi-Fi, a swimming pool, a large theater stage, workshop rooms, open spaces for reflection, a restaurant, and laundry facilities.
